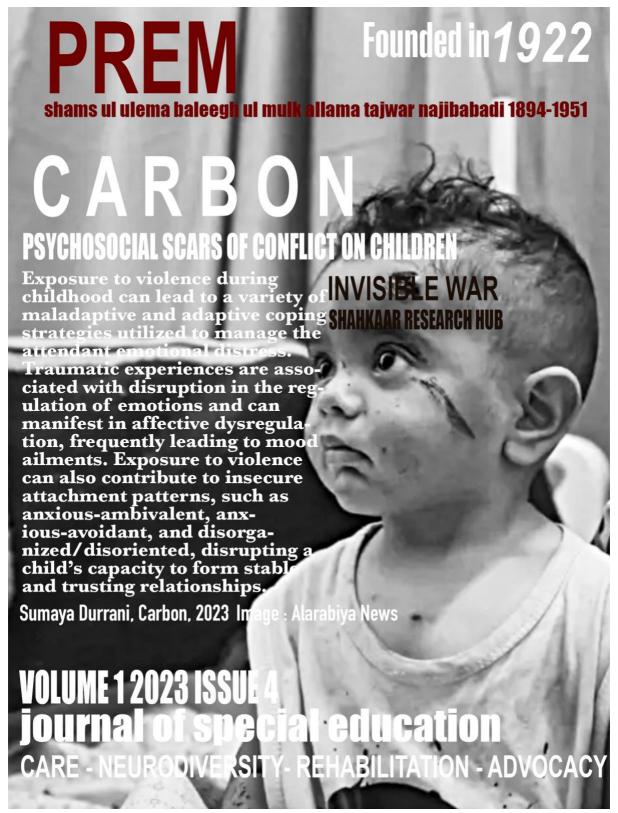

Exposure to violence during childhood can lead to a variety of maladaptive and adaptive coping strategies utilized to manage the attendant emotional distress. Traumatic experiences are associated with disruption in the regulation of emotions and can manifest in affective dysregulation, frequently leading to mood ailments. Exposure to violence can also contribute to insecure attachment patterns, such as anxious-ambivalent, anxious-avoidant, and disorganized/disoriented, disrupting a child's capacity to form stable and trusting relationships.
