

## Carbon: Psychosocial Scars of Conflict on Children - Gaza

The ramifications of physical trauma, particularly in the context of war zones can be far reaching. The longitudinal impacts of war on children are amply evidenced in the literature. Studies suggest that physical trauma sustained in war zones is associated with a host of physical and mental health issues, including immediate injury, disability, and chronic pain. In the long term these can further manifest as more serious ailments resulting from malnutrition, inequitable access to medical care, and mental health services. The psychological toll of living in a war zone has the potential to contribute to delayed post-traumatic stress disorder and cognitive deficits.
